40- HOUR CRISIS INTERVENTION TEAM (CIT) TRAINING



This 40-hour CIT training, sponsored by the Affiliated Sante Group, prepares law enforcement officers to respond to individuals experiencing mental health crises. The program emphasizes verbal de-escalation, early intervention, and collaboration with mental health services to reduce injuries, recidivism, and unnecessary criminal justice involvement. It includes training segments like Mental Diagnosis, Medication, De-escalation, and focuses on various topics such as Developmental Disabilities, Traumatic Brain Injuries, Dementia and much more to help recognize warning signs, reduce stigma, and connect individuals to appropriate care, promoting long-term improvements in crisis response and community outcomes. **This training comes with MPCTC In- service training hours for all sworn personnel.**
