Peer Recovery Specialists transform their lived experience into a source of hope, guidance, and encouragement for others facing mental health and substance use challenges. What you've overcome can become the foundation for helping others discover that recovery is possible.



What Participants Receive

- 50 hours of bundled virtual peer recovery training and training materials
- Opportunities to complete up-to 500 volunteer and/or internship hours through community partners
- Monthly cohort check-ins and ongoing program support
- Resume development, job readiness assistance, and employment support
- One-time support for CPRS examination and certification application fees
- Transportation to and from CPRS exam site

Requirements

- Must be 18 years of age or older
- High school diploma or GED required
- Minimum of 18 months in sustained recovery
- Must reside in a Maryland Eastern Shore county
